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Demographic Profile

The population in the Town of Dundee, FL was 4,738 per American Community Survey data for 2016-2020.

The region has a civilian labor force of 1,758 with a participation rate of 51.2%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in the Town of Dundee, FL, 6.2% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 34.3% in the nation.

The median household income in the Town of Dundee, FL is \$40,956 and the median house value is \$150,300.



Employment Trends

As of 2022Q1, total employment for the Town of Dundee, FL was 1,323 (based on a four-quarter moving average). Over the year ending 2022Q1, employment increased 3.1% in the region.




Employment for Town of Dundee, FL

Wage Trends

The average worker in the Town of Dundee, FL earned annual wages of \$46,256 as of 2022Q1. Average annual wages per worker increased 5.3% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$66,637 in the nation as of 2022Q1.

Cost of Living Index

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 7.8% lower in Town of Dundee, FL than the U.S. average.



Industry Snapshot

The largest sector in the Town of Dundee, FL is Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing and Hunting, employing 297 workers. The next-largest sectors in the region are Retail Trade (218 workers) and Educational Services (158). High location quotients (LQs) indicate sectors in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The sectors with the largest LQs in the region are Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing and Hunting (LQ = 16.63), Other Services (except Public Administration) (1.73), and Retail Trade (1.59).

Employment data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2021Q4 with preliminary estimates updated to 2022Q1.

Sectors in the Town of Dundee, FL with the highest average wages per worker are Mining, Quarrying, and Oil and Gas Extraction (\$92,971), Finance and Insurance (\$70,858), and Wholesale Trade (\$66,401). Regional sectors with the best job growth (or most moderate job losses) over the last 5 years are Retail Trade (+38 jobs), Educational Services (+35), and Health Care and Social Assistance (+27).

Over the next 10 years, employment in the Town of Dundee, FL is projected to expand by 359 jobs. The fastest growing sector in the region is expected to be Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation with a +3.9% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing and Hunting (+108 jobs), Accommodation and Food Services (+61), and Health Care and Social Assistance (+51).

Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in the Town of Dundee, FL is Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations, employing 166 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Sales and Related Occupations (146 workers) and Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (145). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations (LQ = 19.39), Educational Instruction and Library Occupations (1.72), and Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (1.41).

Occupation groups in the Town of Dundee, FL with the highest average wages per worker are Management Occupations (\$102,800), Legal Occupations (\$97,000), and Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (\$88,000). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 1.4% among Management Occupations to 5.1% among Personal Care and Service Occupations.

Over the next 10 years, the fastest growing occupation group in the Town of Dundee, FL is expected to be Healthcare Support Occupations with a +3.5% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations (+65 jobs) and Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (+52). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations (304 jobs) and Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (301).



Occupation employment data are estimated via industry employment data and the estimated industry/occupation mix. Industry employment data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and currently updated through 2021Q4, imputed where necessary with preliminary estimates updated to 2022Q1. Wages by occupation are as of 2021 provided by the BLS and imputed where necessary. Forecast employment growth uses national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics adapted for regional growth patterns.



Education Levels

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in the Town of Dundee, FL is projected to grow 2.4% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 2.8% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to grow 2.4% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 2.7% per year.

What is a location quotient?

A location quotient (LQ) is a measurement of concentration in comparison to the nation. An LQ of 1.00 indicates a region has the same concentration of an industry (or occupation) as the nation. An LQ of 2.00 would mean the region has twice the expected employment compared to the nation and an LQ of 0.50 would mean the region has half the expected employment in comparison to the nation.

What is separation demand?

Separation demand is the number of jobs required due to separations—labor force exits (including retirements) and turnover resulting from workers moving from one occupation into another. Note that separation demand does not include all turnover—it does not include when workers stay in the same occupation but switch employers. The total projected demand for an occupation is the sum of the separation demand and the growth demand (which is the increase or decrease of jobs in an occupation expected due to expansion or contraction of the overall number of jobs in that occupation).

What is a cluster?

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. If a regional cluster has a location quotient of 1.25 or greater, the region is considered to possess a competitive advantage in that cluster.

What is the difference between industry wages and occupation wages?

Industry wages and occupation wages are estimated via separate data sets, often the time periods being reported do not align, and wages are defined slightly differently in the two systems (for example, certain bonuses are included in the industry wages but not the occupation wages). It is therefore common that estimates of the average industry wages and average occupation wages in a region do not match exactly.

What is NAICS?

The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) is used to classify business establishments according to the type of economic activity. The NAICS Code comprises six levels, from the "all industry" level to the 6-digit level. The first two digits define the top level category, known as the "sector," which is the level examined in this report.

What is SOC?

The Standard Occupational Classification system (SOC) is used to classify workers into occupational categories. All workers are classified into one of over 804 occupations according to their occupational definition. To facilitate classification, occupations are combined to form 22 major groups, 95 minor groups, and 452 occupation groups. Each occupation group includes detailed occupations requiring similar job duties, skills, education, or experience.
